



{The nCw Hall of Fame ceremony for the Brothers Holland begins with the camera panning the packed room. There are nCw stars past and present at every table here to honor these two men. The top of the room lays the main table where nCw's main front office members are, along with the stars of the evening and the other Hall of Fame inductees. Kelly Fox, nCw CEO comes to the podium in the middle of the front tables and begins to talk.}

Kelly Fox: First off, I'd just like to thank everybody for being here, and a big thank you to everybody who is watching from home. It's a great honor to be inducting these two men into the Hall of Fame. When nCw opened her doors, Dave and Milo were there and I was deeply saddened when they decided to hang it up. It's been an incredible honor to have them as a part of nCw's history and I'd like to just let them know.... they are free to be a part of nCw any time they choose.

{The crowd in attendance claps.}

Kelly Fox: Without further adu, here are the men of the eveing... the Brothers Holland!

{Everybody in the room stands to their feet clapping as Dave and Milo walk tot he podium. They wave to the crowd, but the crowd continues their applause. After several moments the thunderous roar dies down and Dave and Milo can speak.}

Dave: I never thought I'd see this day. Halls of Fame are for World Champions and multiple world champions. They're not for failed number one contenders... they're not for National champions who last just one week before losing the belt. Halls of Fame are for the successful, the renowned and the respected. And it's on these three merits that explain precisely why we have been inducted into the Hall of Fame. Because The Hall of Fame, like it's first inductee in name and every inductee in description... is an icon. A paragon. A symbol of virtues that every man, woman and child should aspire to. And I am proud to now include myself and Milo among them.

We've done a lot here in nCw. We've done a great deal in just a single year. A year is an important milestone in any federation and I have to say I think this is my first time experiencing the first of a new, bright, shining federation. The Xtreme Hardcore Federation had already been around for a long while

before we showed up there... and everywhere else I've ever been a part of never made it to the one year mark. Of all the federations in my time.. I'm glad to have been here for this one. And I'm even more happy to be numbered among those who've been here from the very start. I just wish I could have bene here from the start of my career... rather than for the last year of it.

I've seen a lot happen over the year. Personally and in nCw. This time last year I was in no man's land personally. Nothing was driving me anymore, nothing could motivate me to even get out of bed. Then I came here and very quickly I started seeing people I'd never heard of before show up and rock my socks off. Lance Ryan, Davey Ortega, Ricky Johnson, Sexy Jason, even the two guys I'm sure people would least expect me to say, Adam Knite and the Punisher. These last two were a wonderful experience for us. For years we've been looking for a real challenge that was also fun to do. Often we'd find people who were the greatest fun to work with but had very little talent... or were incredibly talented but had no sense of humour or entertainment. These boys... well... I just want to personally say thank you for giving us the most entertaining couple of months of our careers.

Milo: We also got to see some people we've known for a while really come into their own. There are a few names that really spring to mind. Joe Everyman, a guy we've always.. y'know what? I'm gonna say it... loved to see... but never really hit the big time. I'm glad to have seen not just an evolution for him.. but pretty much a rebirth. I personally hold no shame that he defeated me.. and I'm proud that he draws such a great strength from that fact.

Another name is sadly no longer around, Christian Kane. We've known him for a while as a byproduct of our friendship with Spike, and back when he started out as Trunkz he was awful. But then again I guess we all are when we're rookies right? But it wasn't until I saw him start here that I saw him become a quality contender and I'm pleased to have seen that.

Which leaves just one man who we have to give a proper honourable mention. Again it's a man many might not expect us to honour in our moment here in the spotlight. He's a man who has called on our names in vain.. a man who has cursed and threatened Dave on numerous occasions, myself on fewer. The Ace. A man who has been wrestling for nearly as long as we have and a man we don't seem to have ever shaken from us. Everywhere we've gone.. there he was. And I tell you right now... you will never find a more tenacious and unrelenting individual than that man. He has given us some of our hardest fought wins in every stage of our careers. We both wish him a long and prolific career.

Dave: Yes.. but now.. now we come to the thank you part of this acceptance speech. I'll try not to be too long but there are a few. In fact in the essence of time saving I'll make it less a thank you list, more an honourable mention list. Firstly I'd like to start with the man I had my first nCw match against, Johnny Craven. Maybe not the best performer in ring but outside the ring I enjoyed his company and I wish him well wherever he is and whatever he's doing. Ricky Johnson, for his efforts and qualities... and for always putting on a good show, no matter the opponent. John Anthony... like Ace a truly tenacious individual but unlike Ace completely respectful with it. To you, John, I wish as much good fortune as any man can. Then there's Jack Manson. A man we've only had the fortune of facing but a few times. I enjoyed each and every one of those times and I'd like to thank him for making us look good consistently. Along a similar line I'd like to extend the same thanks to Steve Awesome. A man again, I've faced on unfortunately few occasions. And almost as if this were a scripted speech, the next name on my list is long time tag partner and flatmate of Steve.. Trent Helms. I owe this man a huge

debt of gratitude. In years to come when highlight videos are made of my promos and matches... there will be one promo that will always feature. Helms Attacks: Indetrentance Day. For those who missed it, look it up on the internet.. I've been told it's an instant classic. But it's one that would never have been without Trent Helms himself.

And finally I have just two more members of the nCw roster to thank. And unsurprisingly they are our fellow Hall of Famers. I'd like to personally thank Lance Ryan for everything he has done. At A Night to Remember, he pushed me to my limit. Something no man has ever done before. He's a man who is gracious in defeat... and proclaiming in victory. After our epic... no.. in his own words.. after our legendary encounter, not once did he focus on the fact that he won. Always he focussed on how hard I fought. He helped me through the disappointment of defeat in the face of nCw's greatest prize. Lance Ryan... I thank you.

Milo: And I.. would like to thank Spike Kane. For both of us. We brought him to nCw, but before nCw was even a glint in Leonard Fox's eye, he brought us into professional wrestling. I know the wars we have fought are bitter... the feud between our blood and is hard to overcome... but there is no man who has done more for us in our career. I don't know if you'd appreciate this gesture... but Spike, Thanks for everything. We couldn't have asked for a better friend.

Dave: And finally... our thanks go to the viewing public. Without whom we wouldn't be here. Because as I said at the outset, each Hall of Famer should be an icon that others aspire to. I've always prided myself on being a testament to being honest and righteous in the face of controversy. Without people to be an icon for, who am I? Who are either of us? We're nobodies. Just a big man and his speedy sidekick out to fight the world. No. You people out there accepted this duo as people to be followed and learned from. And it is from you that others have learned. Others in the world outside and the world within the ring. So, thank you nCw. No matter how good you think we've been for you... I can say with a degree of certainty that you have been better to us.

Milo: Don't forget us. Now we're retired, our legacy is all that's left. But that legacy no longer belongs to us. Take it as you need... draw from it what you will... but above all, take good care of it. That it may benefit others as it did you. Defend it in our stead... and above all, respect what it has achieved tonight. Acclaim beyond gold and titles. Thank you all... we've been great.

{With that the crowd again stands to their feet and cheers the two men who gave nCw all they had. The show fades away to the theme of "What I've Done" by Linkin Park as a video montage of all of the Brother's accomplishments play.}
